

Response to Intervention

(RtI): A Fact Sheet for Parents

You will be hearing about RtI. This sheet will provide a basic overview.

RtI (Response to Intervention) is a **general education effort for ALL students** to identify and help those students who need academic or behavioral help long before they fail. RtI includes:

- High quality instruction for ALL students based on research (what we know to work) and aligned to common core state standards (matched to what student must know and be able to do)
- Universal Screening: A quick check of students' current level of performance in a content or skill area
- Tiered instruction which allows some students to receive increasing levels of instructional help based on their specific needs in the general education curriculum academic and behavioral (See the Three- Tier Model below for details)
- Data-Based Decision Making: The use of student data to guide the design, implementation, and adjustment of instruction. Data is gathered by monitoring student performance.
- Parental Engagement: Parents are part of the team regarding their child's needs, interventions, goals and expected progress
